


Joanna Duncombe is based between the UK and France; Jo manages new talent and film programmes in the MENA region at British Council. She is passionate about championing underrepresented voices in world cinema. Jo was creative producer at Birds' Eye View, championing women's cinema, and launched their Reclaim the Frame programme.

She has previously worked in curatorial roles with the Independent Cinema Office and London Short Film Festival. Jo is the UK programmer for Victoria Film Festival in Canada and curates films for CASA Festival of Latin American Arts. She has worked as an impact strategist on documentaries including *A Syrian Love Story*.

Bracken Hanuse Corlett is an interdisciplinary artist hailing from the Wuikinuxv and Klahoose Nations. He began working in theatre and



performance in 2000 and eventually transitioned towards his current practice that fuses sculpture, painting and drawing with digital-media, audio-visual performance, animation and narrative. He is a graduate of the En'owkin Centre of Indigenous Art and went to Emily Carr University of Art and Design for Visual Arts. He is the Co-founder of the Vancouver Indigenous Media Arts Festival and recently sat on the VIFF Canadian Features Jury. He has studied Northwest Coast art, carving and design from acclaimed Heiltsuk artists Bradley Hunt and his sons Shawn Hunt and Dean Hunt. He was a recipient of the 2014 BC Creative Achievement Award for Aboriginal Art and has recently received public art commissions from the Cities of Vancouver, Nanaimo and Victoria. He is currently the 2020-21 Artist in Residence at Raycam Cooperative Centre as part of the Artists in Communities Program.

Jane Julian's love of movies began as a small child at the drive-in where the family saw *Ben Hur* (and later, *Goldfinger*, which made a big impression!) Jane has been the programming director for the Port Townsend Film Festival for the past 8 years after getting her start as a founder of the the



Durango Film Fest (Colorado) in 2000. Jane has been recruited as a “programmer-at-large” for festivals focused on documentary films across North America and says she “absolutely loves it!”



Ammar Keshodia is a filmmaker and curator based in Toronto, Canada. He has worked on the programming teams for festivals such as TIFF, SXSW, and Overlook.

Ammar has written for publications like Bright Wall/Dark Room, NANG Magazine, and Peephole Journal. He is also the co-host of the Three Course Cinema Club, a podcast dedicated to constructing unorthodox triple bills of famous films and hidden gems. Ammar graduated from the University of Toronto with a degree in Political Science & Cinema Studies and his work has been supported by the Canada Council for the Arts.

Alex Rogalski is the senior Canadian programmer for Hot Docs. Past programming work includes the Toronto International Film Festival, Calgary International Film Festival, Gimme Some Truth, and the Human Rights Watch



Film Festival. He is the former Executive Director of PAVED Arts and New Media, and currently a Program Consult with SK Arts in Saskatoon.



Dan Russek is a Professor in the Department of Hispanic and Italian Studies at the University of Victoria. His fields of research are Latin American literature, film, visual arts, and aesthetics. He is the President of the Hispanic Film Society of Victoria and he coordinates the Annual Latin American and Spanish Film Week at Cinecenta, which will turn thirteen in 2023.

Kimber Sider is a documentary filmmaker and the Artistic Director/Lead Programmer for the Guelph Film Festival, one of the oldest documentary film festivals in the world. She holds a PhD in Theatre and Performance from the University of Guelph and is a lecturer in Communication Arts at the University of Waterloo.





The *Ballad of a Great Disordered Heart* is an ode to folk music, told by the people who make it. The film centres on the communities, past and present, of Edinburgh's Old Town - a corner of the city that has long housed a proud and lively Irish diaspora. During lockdown, musician Aidan O'Rourke befriends three of his octogenarian neighbours, all of whom happen to be called Margaret. Inspired by their stories, and a newfound appreciation for his own family roots, he decides to bring together a group of sensational Irish and Scottish folk musicians to investigate the meaning of home and the role of folk music in binding this community together. Featuring a stunning original soundtrack by O'Rourke and live performances by talented musicians including Liam Ó Maonlai, Brìghde Chaimbeul, Comac Begley, Róisín Chambers and Aoife Ní Bhriain, this is a foot stomping and heartwarming journey into the very soul of a musical community. - *JD*

To watch this stunning portrait of the musical force of nature, *Cesária Évora*, is to witness the transformative power of music. Known internationally for her melancholic ballads, Évora was perhaps best known for her interpretation of the immigrant song “Sodade”. A native of the former Portuguese colony Cape Verde, Cesária rose to international acclaim in the 1990s, known around the world as “the barefoot diva”.

Director Ana Sofia Fonseca has extensively mined footage and sourced great interviews to create her definitive look at the life and music of this giant of vocal performance. Her interviews with the family, celebrity friends, and with impresario, manager, and lifelong supporter José da Silva are great, but the real magical moments belong to Cesária. Her music and her unwavering commitment to her own freedom steal the show, and probably your heart in the bargain. - *BS*

In her directorial debut from her own original screenplay, Frances O'Connor dives into the mysterious figure of Emily Brontë - the middle sister of the infamous Brontë Sister clan, world famous for penning *Wuthering Heights*. At the time of its publication, the book was shocking for its visceral, bodily portraits of love and rebellion. Here, in *Emily*, we see the traces of the rebellious soul behind the words. Emily Brontë (Emily Mackey, *Sex Education*) is a solitary misfit, plagued by shyness, and known as 'the strange one' in her local village. When an overwhelming pull of attraction brings both inner fire and crushing pain in rapid succession, she attempts to escape into wild imaginary worlds with her sisters Charlotte and Anne. But her sisters, drawn increasingly into adult conformism, are slowly leaving their sister behind. While Emily's maverick brother Branwell encourages her creativity, her father engages a French tutor to focus her free spirit. As Emily, Mackey delivers a standout performance, cementing her status as one of the UK's most promising rising stars. - *JD*

Lawrence Kweller (Isaiah Lehtinen) loves movies. His encyclopedic film knowledge and *Saturday Night Live* viewing rituals are both a path to escapism and a point of pride. He's still in high school, but is unreasonably confident his fate is to emulate his indie-filmmaking heroes and attend NYU's film school. Lawrence can imagine nothing worse than remaining stuck in his suburban life, going to a local university and being deemed a 'Canadian' director. His exasperated single mother provides the unvarnished truth that American tuition is beyond their means, but Lawrence is undeterred and pursues his dream job at a video store, attempting to save his minimum wage earnings to help cover the cost. The disconnect between Lawrence's dreams and reality delivers the laughs, but also fuels the empathy that drives the film. Chandler Levack's debut feature is an unforgettable coming-of-age comedy, led by Lehtinen's pitch perfect performance and filled with throwback early 2000's pop culture references when DVDs were the peak of technology, and Netflix was an upstart company delivering them by mail. - AR

In 1970s Rome, Penélope Cruz plays Clara, radiant in the role of a Spanish woman struggling to fit in with the traditions of the bourgeois Italian family she's married into. With a short-tempered husband, she'll take any opportunity she can get to bring joy into the home for their children.

In between the domestic drama, her oldest child Andrea begins to reflect on his gender identity. Born female, he introduces himself as a boy when he meets a girl in a Romani community behind their building, marginalized by land development in the neighborhood.

Though their innocent romance burgeons over the course of the lazy summer, tensions rise at home. Through it all Andrea and Clara forge a special connection; they're always trying to hold back each other from reaching escape velocity, but secretly they find comfort as the only two people in the family who truly see one another.

L'immensita never treats its most important themes like the achingly contemporary issues they are. It approaches its characters' concerns with intimate sensitivity, all the while capturing their most important moments together with a vivid flair that paints them as your own bittersweet memories. Much like Cruz's character, it has a grand heart, protected fiercely, waiting to be revealed only when you need it most. - AK

In *First Reformed* the vehicle is religion, *The Card Counter* it's gambling and in *Master Gardener* we dally in the philosophy of gardening — the natural world that can bring peace.

But it's not all about gardening. The lady of the grounds, Norma Haverhill (Sigourney Weaver) is a rich domineering white woman. Her latest request of Narvel is to provide gardening instruction to her grandniece. Complex relationships ensue.

Strong acting is on display with Edgerton's low-key vibe playing well against Weaver's overbearingly entitled role as landowner. *Master Gardener* is alive with subtext and cinematic intensity that we've come to appreciate from Schrader. - KK

Seventeen-year-old Ana lives in 1970's Bucharest. Current issues with her boyfriend are quickly eclipsed with the bigger problems she and her group of friends find themselves in. One night while partying together they write a letter to Metronom, a radio show hosted by an exiled Romanian rock music DJ on the US propaganda network, Radio Free Europe. This being Ceausescu's Romania, they quickly find themselves in the hands of the secret police.

This impressive debut won Alexandru Belc the directing award in the *Un Certain Regard* section at Cannes (2022), and it is easy to see why. The restraint and control shown in performance, camera, and tone are masterful. The Door's "Light my Fire" has become a classic rock radio cliché, but in the hands of Belc, and his freedom seeking Romanian teens, it is restored to its original incarnation as a paean of youthful awakening and liberation.

Once in the custody of the Securitate, Ana will be forced to make choices that will have life altering consequences. *Metronom* is a film which serves as a timely reminder about the nature of political oppression, freedom, and the potentially liberating power of music. - BS



From the opening shots of a pink-hued tropical sunset stretching over Tahitian townscapes and nightclubs, the feeling of being in the hands of an assured storyteller is palpable. Director Albert Serra's political thriller is set on French Polynesian island of Tahiti, with the story centered on French official, the High Commissioner of the Republic, De Roller (Benoît Magimel). De Roller must present steady assurance to the Indigenous Tahitians that the French nuclear testing of the past will not be returning, despite the recent appearance of a French submarine. There are many willing to escalate confrontation with France (and thus De Roller) over their concerns for their homeland. The film is propelled as much by atmosphere and nuanced performance as by plot, with dread mixing easily with tropical beauty. Many framings are reminiscent of tourist postcards while Serra interrogates colonial structures. Wonderfully grounded by the swirling Polynesian soundtrack, we seek to understand De Roller's motivations and sympathies. - BS



As they adapt to different cultural norms, they can't avoid racism at both work and school, resulting in conflict at home. Caught between two worlds, both struggle to find their place and defend themselves. Balancing perspectives of a mother doing her best to protect and provide for her son, and a young boy (then teenager) facing cruel injustices, the film travels full circle returning its protagonists back to Korea where they seek healing from the wounds they have endured. Navigating a complex web of relationships that draws from Shim's own experiences, he textures the 1990's setting with specific details that make the film and its story feel timeless. Immigration stories provide rich material for characters, as they inherently include forces of transformation, both physical and emotional. While Oliv-focussed, Rodden-Shortt contextualizes Howe in time, delivering a great history of the Vancouver community and the struggles and challenges overcome.

Never content to allow the even archival black and white photos to be stilted but functional, the film is notable stylistically for its constant additions of colour and movement. Those with a passing interest in the world the film celebrates will be sure to find many points of entry and education, especially in Oliv’s “real talk” approach to life. 

When she wins the coveted Vogue award for the Best Young Designer of the Year, she embarks on a mission to create a sustainable collection from field to finished garment, to transform her entire business. Over the following three years, her own personal revolution becomes the precursor of a much bigger, societal change. *Fashion Reimagined* captures the fashion industry at the point of seismic change, traversing the societal architectures of the super wealthy, and the natural habitats at the mercy of an industry in desperate need of a revolution. - JD

In her submission to the VFF, director Maryna ER Gorbach made the following statement: "As soon as the war started on the border of Russia and Ukraine I can't stop thinking about women and children there. Sure, I cannot stop it, but I can tell the story of my feelings about occupied family, trying to survive whatever. Klondike stands against gun machines as mostly unnatural creation of a human. And also ... it is a dream about morning."

One shot.


The aptly named Belarusian director, Boris Guts, had to shoot *Minsk* in Estonia rather than his native country. Producer Vitali Shkliarov personally lived through the depicted events and spent four months in jail. Those who are fans of the work of Paul Greengrass (*Bloody Sunday*, *Captain Phillips*) or Cuarón’s *Children of Men*, will find many similarities in this tense and courageous work. - BS

The film never strays into the territory of cultures clashing, but the unreasonable bureaucratic decisions make it difficult to accept the actions taken by the government. Humans with close relationships with wolves and wolfdogs is the subject documented by Vancouver directors Isabelle Grog and Mike McKinlay. We meet three different BC based wolf/human pairings, including one from Victoria. Given that many audiences might not understand the dangerous attraction of being so close to wolves, the film does a great job of allowing the subjects the opportunity to describe that fascination. One of the participants is a rural couple who keep several wolfdogs in pens for “wolf education”, another is a woman who follows and photographs a wild wolf she claims a close relationship with, and the last a young Vancouver woman who has a wolfdog with hip problems.

Ethical questions quickly arise as we meet and begin to personalize the animals. There are some questionable motives, but the filmmakers give time to knowledgeable voices, who offer perspectives that contextualize much of the wolf relationship boosterism. By the time tragedy rears its head, the early hints of the problems with domestic/wild animal hybrids are addressed. The footage of the island wolves is so beautiful and so familiar, this film is sure to have you joining the pack to learn more about these glorious creatures.

Producer Kevin Eastwood previously produced *Haida Modern*, which was the closing night film at VFF in 2020. - BS



Lucas is dismissive of those around him while claiming to want to know the inhabitants better. Ignoring the bishop's advice of adapting to the locals and their customs, a dynamic is set that will have severe consequences.



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

When filmmaker Oscar Harding’s grandfather passes away deep in the countryside of rural Somerset, England, he makes a surprise discovery. His grandfather Charles Carson - a farmer - was also a surrealist, amateur filmmaker. On inheriting an extraordinary, feature length home-video, Harding unravels the surprising and rich history of his grandfather’s unconventional, creative life. Behind the daily rituals of running a working farm, Charles was a death-positive artist whose cinematic gaze variously captured the birthing of cows, lawnmower races with skeletons, and even a farmyard re-enactment of ‘Scotland the Brave’. This treasure of a film is an homage to the family archive, and a stark reminder of what could be lost if we don’t look deep down into our own family histories.

A Life on the Farm is a touching, sometimes laugh-out-loud, tribute to the linking thread of artistic expression that can connect family members, and indeed public audiences, through the generations. - *JD*

The producer behind *Big Man Japan* (2007) sits in the director's chair in this dryly comic and delightful Ninja action film. *Family Mottoes* focuses on a retired ninja named Monkey. Monkey's wife Spider is established as an active and very deadly ninja, and they raise their four ninja kids in the forest. After rescuing an amnesiac old man from a sniper, the family finds they have invited trouble that they will need to confront, ninja-style!

Though *Family Mottoes* soundtrack is pulsating 70s string infused orchestral funk, and the film references the visual techniques and themes of the 60s Samurai era, it defies easy categorization, and prefers to look for the laughs in the action and violence. At its core, the film is about the strength of a supportive family working to common ends. Come expecting beautiful period costuming, sentimental music, and a family of skilled martial artists kicking ass side by side in a righteous battle. - *BS*

Handshake is an American “true indie” film that calibrates its parameters for success very tightly, and then overdelivers in almost every way. A comic crime drama reminiscent in tone to early Coen brothers’ films. Director Robert Shupe’s film is a strange little tale that revolves around the unlikely meeting of two men on a mid-western riverbank, family man Bill Burdick and micro-level drug dealer Devin Fowler. Both men have money troubles, and they swiftly devise a sinister scheme to solve their collective financial woes. But after crimes are committed, the dim-witted Devin soon finds out that perhaps Bill had another plan all along...

Handshake moves along at an enjoyably breezy pace. Shupe displays an abundance of talent with his script and the performances he directs (including himself in the role of hapless criminal Devin). Shupe’s Devin is the constant throughout and given what he seems to be capable of as a writer, director, and actor, we can expect to see much more from him in the future. - BS

Happy Pills is a film about the surge in the use of pharmaceutical drugs worldwide. The film truly approaches the issue with a global mindset, from young fruit-seller in Niger taking Tramadol (a powerful street painkiller), to an American teen turning to Adderall and Ritalin to treat his attention deficit disorder. We are introduced to a young gay man from Tel Aviv, who takes pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) pills as a way to skirt condom use, a swiss man fighting a depression battle chemically, and a young woman from the Peruvian Amazon who injects herself with contraceptives to give herself and her 4 children a better chance. *Happy Pills* wraps with a French intellectual suffering from pancreatic cancer, who is considering Pentobarbital to consciously end his life. All these stories are relatable, humanized, and well considered.

In a space potentially rife with controversies and pitfalls, directors Robert and Woods have decided to take a traditional, non-judgemental documentary approach and allow those whose lives are impacted by “Happy Pills” in different ways to speak for themselves. While there is intention here, this is formally a rejection of the kind of catastrophizing documentary style that dominates many streaming sites. It sounds heavy, but in practice the film is endlessly fascinating, and the great camera work and editing is a helpful “spoonful of sugar”. I am sure those watching it will find themselves reflecting on this film for some time.

The oldest tattoo parlor in the world is in Jerusalem. For 27 generations the Razzouk family have been tattooing thousands of people and specializing in tattooing pilgrims who want to commemorate their journey.

The Razzouk Tattoo parlor, located in a small store near the Jaffa Gate, (marked with a wooden sign that reads, Tattoo with heritage since 1300), is run today by Wassim Razzouk, who is from the younger generation.

Wassim, the sole heir of Coptic Christian tattoo artists from Jerusalem, sets out to complete his collection of ancient wooden stencils before they are lost forever. Noble venture perhaps but it turns out that they are in the hands of his feuding family members.

Director Ronell's third movie deals with similar themes of the first two, family. Here we are introduced to quite the collection of characters, a reluctant aunt, a less skillful uncle and the flamboyant cousin. While the story might raise the eyebrows it evolves into a story of tolerance and forgiveness. - *KK*

Lovable if annoying artistic dreamer Clay's significant other Whitney has left him alone in Los Angeles. He has given himself a "sort of" mod haircut, has beer, and is prepared to waste all that time, all by himself.

While out taking pictures for a very theoretical future photography show, he happens upon an old hometown friend, a self-conscious clinger named Whit. As it turns out, Whit is a ghost and Clay is the only person on earth who can see him. Clay and Whit's exploitations of the possibilities for shenanigans of this situation start amusingly, but as some of Whit's ghost powers assert themselves in sinister ways, questions emerge about whether Whit is a "friendly ghost". Actor Robert Longstreet's appearance as a coked-out gambler/movie producer adds a great burst of energy mid-film, and many of the supporting cast really bring it on the day.

Both being Stone Quacker alumni, much of the charm here comes from the tone set by the two leads long developed comedic banter. This is the kind of film you watch with a detached ironic grin on your face until the well-executed moments of emotional poignancy come out of nowhere and some of the hard questions glossed over by the LA slacker talk are suddenly foregrounded. - *BS*

Anyone who puts pigments on paper or who loves bold colourful visuals will not want to miss this latest work by *AI Purdy Was Here* director Brian D. Johnson. This NFB produced work documents the inventive work of Toronto ink maker Jason Logan. Logan's inks are custom made and he sources all the ingredients himself. Logan sketches out the history of humanity's creation and use of ink, and how his practice is just another step in a long chain of unlocking the secrets of capturing colour. Watching his alchemical wizardry, combining rare materials to create vibrant colours, true blacks, and even white inks, is somehow extremely satisfying.

Some of the most visually striking scenes involve Logan's clients putting his ink to use. A particularly memorable scene involves the Japanese artist Koji Kakinuma using his black inks to make giant calligraphy. Margret Atwood appears to discuss her use of traditional quill and ink and her feelings about the relationship of tactile writing to memory. Brian D. Johnson and cinematographer Nicholas de Pencier have made a lush visual work that may inspire a resurgence of interest in the analogue and chemical practice of organic ink making. - *BS*

But beneath its mix of brightly coloured bears launching deadly fusillades of heart tipped arrows is an emotionally grounded story of two brothers, the over-confident Bluey and his fearful sibling Tubby, and how their relationship to their mother will impact not only themselves but be a hinge-point in the unicorn wars. 


BEFORE I CHANGE MY MIND

Robin moves to a rural Alberta town and immediately faces identity questions, including “Are you a boy or a girl?” Director Trevor Anderson navigates gender roles in his debut feature, staging a coming-of-age drama that relishes in its 1987 setting, complete with neon colors and big hair. Robin gets involved with the school bully, and together they provoke each other through middle school drama including band trips to Edmonton, school dances and playground antics. Robin’s single father (Matthew Rankin) is sensitive to his child’s situation, but also faces his own personal and professional dilemmas. Anderson has often played a role in his semi-biographical short films that blend fantasy with reality, and he doesn’t disappoint in his role as a passionate theatre director tasked with the school play. Balancing the complexity of adolescent years with an ensemble cast of adults who appear comfortable in their own skin but are no less socially awkward, *Before I Change My Mind* is a fun and enlightening exploration of familiar characters that doesn’t end with pronouns. - AR

Clement Virgo's highly anticipated adaptation of the award-winning novel by David Chariandy has been doing the rounds at all the major Canadian festivals since debuting at TIFF, and audiences are talking about the power of this storytelling.

Shifting between the mid-nineties and ten years earlier, the title's brothers Michael (Lamar Johstone) and Francis (Aaron Pierre) are raised by their strict Jamaican born mother in a small apartment, and these time shifts allow Virgo to contextualize the boys later decisions. Their Scarborough housing project world is permeated by violence, with many of older brother Francis's friends involved in gang enforcement. After dropping out of high school, the more popular Francis finds escape and community in the developing hip hop and DJ scene, while the more studious and strait-laced Michael peruses the affections of "the smartest girl in the school" Aisha.

Throughout the film is the two brothers climb a hydro tower to see the Toronto skyline, which serves as an excellent visual metaphor. They keep climbing, but try as they might, will the brothers reach the top and climb out of the poverty, violence, and oppressive policing? Killer soundtrack, great performances, and an assured director delivering a powerful story. This is just solid drama. - *BS*

Maria fends for herself and tries to make the best out of a bad situation, showing outstanding grit and courage. At the recycling centre, she befriends Tadeo, a sweet boy who makes her stay more bearable. *Daughter of Rage* is the first narrative film by Nicaraguan Laura Baumeister, who shows a glimpse of a troubling side of her country. She also provides an emotional and uncompromising take on topical issues that affect the developing world, such as extreme poverty, child neglect and abuse, and a lack of solidarity and government services. - DR

This might be the last time she gets to make a trip like this so Charles reluctantly agrees to stop at some of her favourite spots along the way.

It quickly becomes an engrossing journey as Madeleine slowly reveals her surprisingly dark life story and why each of these places was important to her. Through her honesty and wisdom, she helps Charles find his own footing as he reflects on his home life and a marriage on the brink of divorce.

Famous French singer, Line Renaud, as the bright Madeleine, serves a beautiful foil to Charles, played by comedian Dany Boon, who breaks new ground with a layered performance that develops to a moving climax. Their real-life rapport translates into an unforgettable friendship on-screen in a story about the resilience that hides behind every woman that's grown up through these changing times. - AK

Jacir is a young refugee of the Syrian war, resettled by the government in Memphis TN, and working in a Middle Eastern restaurant. His co-worker Jerome, a struggling hip hop artist, is discriminated against by the boss, a middle eastern immigrant himself whose daughter Nadia seems to take an interest in helping Jacir adapt to his new environment.

Jacir's neighbourhood is in a depressed part of town, and his neighbour Meryl, portrayed by the *Soprano's* Lorraine Bracco in a standout role, is a Fox News brain-poisoned opioid addict who hurls racist slurs casually his way. Seeking to understand this new American world, Jacir begins to create unlikely relationships while trying to stay out of the grip of Simmons, an ICE agent who suspects Jacir should be deported.

It is impossible to discuss the film without mentioning the heroic performance by Malek Rahbani, who with every look and winning smile has the audience falling deeper in love with his Jacir. Director Waheed AlQawasmi, himself an immigrant from Jordan, gets a lot right with his approach to his characters. No one is written off as a "deplorable" beyond hope. People are complicated, and ethical issues can be nuanced. His use of socially charged hip hop gives this winning drama a gritty charge. - *BS*

Child actor Loti Kovačič is absolutely electrifying to watch in her portrayal of 10-year-old Moja in Sara Kern's beautifully realized family drama debut.

As the youngest in an immigrant Slovenian family, Moja is witness to her father and sister's deep grief following their move to Australia. Heavily pregnant teen Vesna struggles to deal with imminent motherhood following the death of her and Moja's mother. Father Milo is emotionally absent and in no position to rally his fracturing family. The task falls to little Moja, who tries to fill the missing maternal role. She is surprisingly competent, but the results are mixed, and to see the heroic effort of such a young child are both heartache-inducing and a joy.

A real chemistry is apparent between these sisters, and to see the traumatized slam-poet Vesna being cared for by Moja, who is concerned about things like maternal nutrition in ways Vesna cannot be, is deeply touching. The director's use of improv and repetition with her young actor Loti pays off with one of the best child performances I have seen on-screen. - *BS*

Emily Whitehead is newly diagnosed with a rare form of leukemia at age 6. Thrust into the nightmare of the American healthcare system, her parents quickly learn of the difficulty and hardship of being seriously ill in the United States. Academy Award winner Ross Kaufman (*Born into Brothels*), assembles a detailed documentary that focuses on the life of Emily Whitehead, her parents along with their medical team of caregivers.

Oncologist Dr. Carl June, who lost a close family member to cancer, now devotes his life to cancer research. The miracle is his discovery and Emily's journey as their stories converge. All of Dr. June's research and work are on the line when Emily becomes the first child to enroll in his clinical trial.

Kaufman puts together an emotionally compelling narrative, intimate structure, and exquisite cinematic touches that take viewers on a pulse-pounding journey to save a life. Every frame of his film is filled with heart — both in front of and behind the lens. - JJ

His straightforward explanation understates the magic that this fabulous foursome elicits when they come together. In addition to Jackson, there’s lead singer Rawan who uses make-up and vocal range to express herself; Spenser, their high energy drummer with a love of punk; and finally, piano prodigy Ron who also possesses an impressive talent for knowing the correct day of the week for any date in history. As eclectic as their individual tastes are, it’s their love of music that brought them together to jam. After working out some impressive covers, they decide to take the plunge to write and record original tracks. Guided by their musical director Maury, the band reveals how their personal experiences have shaped their writing, but the looming anticipation of a live show to launch their EP brings another level of stress to a group that has already exceeded so many expectations. - AR

When Mia dips into an unsuspecting restaurant to avoid the rain, she's caught in a shocking terrorist attack that leaves her conscience shattered. Months later, she's still unable to remember exactly what happened that night and struggles to put the pieces back together.

A support group of survivors meets again at the restaurant every week, and there, she forges a connection with Thomas, recognizing a shared glance from moments before the attack, as he helps her make sense of her place in the events of that night. With its stirring score and tender edit, *Paris Memories* emulates the pensive process of recollection, as Mia recalls sounds, smells, and images that make up fragments of a larger whole. Following the delicate trail of these echoes, she begins a poignant journey around the city – a pilgrimage of sorts – to try and find the man that helped her survive.

While the events of this story ring like a fresh wound for France, director Alice Winocour makes an important point of centering the experience of the victims and their search for solace. It recognizes that community can be borne even out of death and tragedy. A shared traumatic experience bonds the victims together in ways even Mia's closest friends and family can't understand. She's unable to complete the puzzle on her own, and it's the collective memory of the survivors that help her find what she needs. - AK

Claire Doyon has created an extraordinary portrait of her family ordeals since her daughter Pénélope's autism diagnosis at age three and a half. Unlike many films of this type, Doyon did not have an autism diagnosis and decide to learn filmmaking to become an advocate. Her journey in motherhood started as an already fully realized award winning filmmaker, with feature films which had screened at Cannes, Locarno, Venice, and Clermont-Ferrand... The film making is as strong as the passion behind the creation.

In this affecting film, Doyon uses a mix of DV, stills, Super 8, and HD footage to trace the stages of her and Pénélope's relationship, and their responses to autism over a period of eighteen years. The fact that she moves from diagnosis, to denial, to acceptance and beyond while crafting an honest, nonmanipulative film is really special. Narrating the film herself, Doyon's self-examination of her decisions with appropriate hindsight are illuminating and touching. - *BS*

Patricia (Hayley Bennett) hasn't seen her ex-husband for over a decade. In their time apart, her brash and somewhat self-absorbed character has flourished, untempered. One night, she arrives at a country hotel in Cornwall, only to discover it is run by the girlfriend (Marisa Abela) of her former husband, Idris (Sam Riley). Things are immediately, and unsurprisingly, awkward. Patricia's abrasive character quickly disrupts the gentler ambiance of Idris' new life, as the pain of past memories and traumas are re-earthed. When the hedonism of Idris's former musician's lifestyle threatens to re-surface, tensions between the reluctant trio begin to mount over a long, messy evening. Adams' direction and work with actors is unconventional, fostering an organic approach to plot development in collaboration with his cast. The result is a romantic drama that unfolds with a spirit of aliveness and natural rhythm, exploring the possibility of new beginnings when confronted with the past. - *JD*

Fyzal Boulifa, a British director of Moroccan descent, has created a unique film about sexuality and queerness in an Islamic majority country. The story of a precarious former Moroccan sex worker Fatima-Zahra and her son Selim are given a lot of context by the director, being filtered through a class-conscious, post-colonial lens. Seeking to out-run her past and give them both a new beginning, Fatima-Zahra moves with Selim to Tangiers, looking for opportunity. Their mother-son relationship is volatile, and each new stress they encounter puts their strained and transactional relationship in jeopardy.

When a local criminal offers Selim a way to make money by being “friendly” with a wealthy Frenchman whose eye Selim has caught, Selim must make choices not unlike like those his mother once made. For those caught in precarious situations, are they even choices? Fatima-Zahra meanwhile makes a play for respectability by trying to become the second wife of a bus driver she has met. A fascinating film, and an adept and entertaining character study. The interactions between the wealthy western gay homeowner and Selim are particularly interesting in their interrogations of colonial legacy, and what the personal costs of homosexual relationships are to each of them in Moroccan society. - *BS*

It is unusual for a film to have two directors, let alone three, but this heartfelt film about an alcoholic getting sober feels locked on target, and the result of a singular focus.

Matt (director Robert Grabow) is an alcoholic who has hit rock bottom. Given the opportunity to see his dying mother in hospice if he can maintain sobriety for 30 days, he is given a fortuitous jumpstart: being thrown in the drunk tank. With 2 days of enforced sobriety under his belt, Matt takes refuge at his AA sponsor Fred's (*Reservation Dog's* Jon Proudstar) Montana farm and finds support, wisdom, and new friend: a stray dog he names Yup'ik. This leads to Matt's discovery of dog snow pulling (a kind of competitive weightlifting for dogs) and a new hope that perhaps he can succeed where he has failed so many times before.

Anchored with fine performances, with many prolific Indigenous American actors in the cast, this is a film that pulls above its weight. Though set amidst a chilly Montana winter, this is one intended to warm the heart. - *BS*



However, CW’s interest in Madison is not motivated by friendliness, but something sinister.

Influencer’s Vancouver based director, Kurtis Harder, delivers a clever thriller with flourishes of horror and social commentary. Cassandra Naud is entrancing when she unleashes her inner coldblooded, manipulative sociopath, and the tight script keeps the twists coming. Thailand’s beaches, temples, and islands are given a lot of play and the camera crew certainly earned their pay with so many of the beautifully set-up shots. *Influencer* asks interesting questions about the nature of social media without losing sight of the fact it is a thriller, and in its taut 92 minutes it delivers plenty of thrills. - BS



Interviewer: Richard Crouse

Richard Crouse is the regular film critic for the 24 hour news source CTV's News Channel and CP24. His syndicated Saturday afternoon radio show, *The Richard Crouse Show*, originates on News Talk 1010 in Toronto. BRINGING FILM TO LIFE... AN ART EXHIBIT

We are once again hosting an art exhibition in The Atrium during the Film Festival. This year our theme is Bringing Film to Life. The Exhibition reflects the current work of emerging artists with a distinctive and perhaps even peculiar sense of the world. In essence, 10 artists agreed to create three-dimensional works no smaller than 2' X 2'. Key materials used had to include a film poster and film strips. To select the artists, we collaborated with Haus of Owl (HOO), a co-working club for creators. Haus of Owl exists to support the creative spirit, hunger, and process of artists in the world of music, film, fashion, photography and dance.

The VFF has always been interested in the intersection of film and visual arts and has hosted an annual art exhibit since 1999. This year the brief is to create 'something else' from materials not traditionally used for the purpose while incorporating a sense of bringing film to life. Using a transdisciplinary approach, the artists selected an individually suitable form and without adhering to any form of stylistic uniformity created objects. The brief also required incorporating another sensory element: audio, scent, or tactile that represents the poster subject matter.





Kurtis David Harder is a prolific director and producer from Canada who's work has played across the world at such festivals as SXSW, Fantastic, Busan, Fantasia, Sitges, Rotterdam, among many others. He directed his feature film debut at the age of 18, *Cody Fitz*, which went on to play across the world at various film festivals picking up several awards. His second feature film *Incontrol* debuted internationally at FrightFest UK, to rave reviews and was released internationally. His two most recent directorial films *Spiral* and *Summerland*, were both released to critical acclaim.

As a producer he's produced 13 films. *Still/Born* was awarded *The Scariest Film* at The Overlook Film. *What Keeps You Alive*, which debuted at SXSW, was named one of the top 10 horror films of 2018 by Rolling Stone Magazine. In 2019, *Harpoon* was the second-best rated horror film on Rotten Tomatoes, gaining certified fresh at 97%. His most recent producing credits include *Superhost* and *V/H/S/94*, the latter of which was Shudder's most successful release at the time. His latest directorial film *Influencer* is now on the festival circuit and will come out in 2023.

Mychael Danna

Life of Pi, Moneyball,

Mychael Danna is an Academy Award-winning film composer recognized for his evocative blending of non-western traditions with orchestral and electronic music. He composed the transculturally inspired 2013 Oscar and Golden Globe-winning score for Ang Lee's *Life of Pi*. Danna also composed scores for Ang Lee's *The Ice Storm* and *Ride With the Devil*. Other noted credits include Oscar-winning and Oscar-nominated films such as his long time collaborator Atom Egoyan's *The Sweet Hereafter* and *Exotica*, *Moneyball* and *Capote* with director Bennett Miller, *Monsoon Wedding*, *Little Miss Sunshine*, *(500) Days of Summer*, *Being Julia*, Deepa Mehta's *Water*, *Girl, Interrupted*, and Tom McCarthy's *Stillwater*. Often collaborating with his brother Jeff, they have scored *The Imaginarium of Doctor Parnassus* for Terry Gilliam, *The Breadwinner*, *The Addams Family 1 and 2*, and Pixar's *The Good Dinosaur*, and *Onward*. He won an Emmy Award for outstanding music composition for the mini-series *World Without End*. Other television scores include *Alias Grace* (Emmy Nomination), *Tyrant*, (3 Emmy Nominations), *Camelot*, (Emmy Nomination) and *Return to Space* (Emmy Nomination) directed by Oscar-winning directors Elizabeth Chai Vasarhelyi and Jimmy Chin, co-scored with his friend Harry Gregson-Williams. Recent film scores are for *Where the Crawdads Sing* directed by Olivia Newman, and *My Father's Dragon* with director Nora Twomey.

Among Mychael's other awards are the Frederick Loewe Award for Film Composing (2013), the World Soundtrack Awards for Film Composer of the Year, and Best Score of the Year (both 2013), and the Hollywood Film Award for Composer of the Year (2016).

"The most gratifying filmmaking experiences are ones that take effort to unpeel the layers surrounding the heart of the story and to find the best musical expression of that heart," says Danna. "Those are always the film scores I am most proud of."

Wayne Lavallee is a Metis multi-disciplinary artist based in Vancouver.

By 2000 Wayne released his first studio solo album, by 2010 Wayne was a 2 time Juno nominee and multi-award winning recording artist signed with an international record label in France.

In 2014 Wayne composed his first film score *Ballads Not Bullets: Tom Jackson* a short film written and directed by Marie Clements produced by the NFB, since then Wayne has composed 4 other feature films for Marie Clements, the award winning musical documentary *The Road Forward* produced by the NFB, *RED SNOW* and the latest feature in collaboration with co-composer Jesse Zubot, produced by Screen Siren Pictures *Bones of Crows* which made its world premiere at 2022 TIFF festival... *Bones of Crows* will also be featured as a 5 part mini-series for CBC in 2023. Wayne has 3 Leo Award nominations for his scores and a 2022 Leo Award win for Best Musical Score for the lifestyle reality series *Dr.Savannah: Wild Rose Vet*.

Jesse Zubot is a multiple JUNO award-winning musician and an in-demand record producer and film composer. His album productions include Tanya Tagaq's Polaris Prize and JUNO award winning album 'Animism'. In his career he has recorded and performed with an extensive range of artists such as Steve Reich, Dan Mangan, Hawksley Workman, Saul Williams, Destroyer, Marc Ribot, Pura Fé, Stars, Darius Jones, Mother Mother and he is part of Tanya Tagaq's main touring trio. In recent years, Jesse has delved heavily into the world of film scoring. He has been nominated for multiple Canadian Screen Awards, Leo Awards and recently received a SOCAN Award for Achievement in Feature Film (*Indian Horse*). His scoring credits include the upcoming powerful feature film and 5-part CBC series *Bones of Crows*, *Ever Deadly*, *Monkey Beach*, *Indian Horse*, *Two Lovers and a Bear*, *Hector and the Search for Happiness*, *The Whale and the Raven*, and *Koneline: Our Land Beautiful*.
