

She also reviews new releases, does deep dives about classic films, and creates a variety of film-related content.

Her focus is on recommending movies, not criticizing them. She's a member of the HCA, IFSC, OAFFC, and Film Independent.

Joanna Duncombe is based between the UK and France;



Jo manages new talent and film programs in the MENA region at British Council. She is passionate about championing underrepresented voices in world cinema. Jo was creative producer at Birds' Eye View, championing women's cinema, and launched their Reclaim the Frame program. She has previously worked in curatorial roles with the Independent Cinema Office and London Short Film Festival. Jo is the UK programmer for Victoria Film Festival and curates films for CASA Festival of Latin

American Arts. She has worked as an impact strategist on documentaries including *A Syrian Love Story*.



Bracken Hanuse Corlett is an interdisciplinary artist hailing from the Wuikinuxv and Klahoose Nations. He began working in theatre and performance in 2000 and eventually transitioned towards his current practice that fuses sculpture, painting and drawing with digital-media, audio-visual performance, animation and narrative. He is a graduate of the En'owkin Centre of Indigenous Art and went to Emily Carr University of Art and Design for Visual

Arts. He is the co-founder of the Vancouver Indigenous Media Arts Festival and recently sat on the VIFF Canadian Features Jury. He has studied Northwest Coast art, carving and design from acclaimed Heiltsuk artists Bradley Hunt and his sons Shawn Hunt and Dean Hunt. He was a recipient of the 2014 BC Creative Achievement Award for Aboriginal Art and has recently received public art commissions from Vancouver, Nanaimo and Victoria. He was the 2020-21 Artist in Residence at Raycam Cooperative Centre as part of the Artists in Communities Program.



John Debono is a Toronto-based documentary programmer and arts administrator. He was previously the programming manager for the JAYU Human Rights Film Festival and worked with the TIFF Docs team. He has also worked as an accessibility consultant with organizations like Hot Docs and Inside Out Toronto, helping to make film festivals a welcoming place for people living with disabilities. In between, he is mentoring young film students at the University of Toronto and Humber Polytechnic College.

Liam Lacey was a film critic for The Globe and Mail from 1995-2015, writing reviews, profiles, and covering the Cannes and Toronto and Sundance film festivals. He has contributed to Variety, Cinema Scope, Screen, Entertainment Weekly, CBC, National Public Radio and served on several film juries. He currently contributes to the film review site, Original-Cin.ca and writes for POV Magazine, a Canadian magazine focusing on documentary films.



Megan Leonard a creative producer, and festival programmer based in Seattle, WA. Her projects have premiered at top-tier festivals around the world, including Sundance, SXSW and Fantasia. Leonard started working for film festivals in 2010 and currently leads the New American Cinema and Shorts teams at the Seattle International Film Festival. She has also programmed for Indie Memphis and DOC NYC, served on juries at Fantastic Fest, Cleveland International Film Festival and Palm Springs ShortFest, and provided programming mentorship at SXSW and the Film Independent Forum.



Kathleen Mullen For the past 20+ years, Kathleen has contributed to the planning and execution of film and art festivals nationally and internationally as curator, programmer, and artistic director. Currently she programs with Seattle International Film Festival, Victoria Film Festival, Vancouver Latin American Film Festival, and Frameline. For 9 years, Kathleen was the Artistic Director leading the programming and operations Seattle Queer Film Festival



(SQFF). Other festivals Kathleen works with include the Whistler Film Festival and Skoden Indigenous Film Festival at Simon Fraser University. Kathleen has also programmed for Toronto International Film Festival, Hot Docs, Vancouver Queer Film Festival, Inside Out Toronto LGBT Film Festival, Planet in Focus, Vancouver International Film Festival, and Boston Museum of Fine Arts.

Alex Rogalski is the senior Canadian programmer for Hot Docs. Past programming work includes the Toronto International Film Festival, Calgary International Film Festival, Gimme Some Truth, and the Human Rights Watch Film Festival. He is the former Executive Director of PAVED Arts and New Media, and currently a Program Consult with SK Arts in Saskatoon.



Dan Russek is Professor in Hispanic and Italian Studies at the University of Victoria. His fields of research are Latin American literature, film, visual arts, and aesthetics. He is the President of the Hispanic Film Society of Victoria and he coordinates the Annual Latin American and Spanish Film Week at Cinecenta.

Maarten Stoltz is the Senior Programmer at Movies that Matter, Sales Manager at the Dutch film distributor Reveal Films, and a board member of the Alumni Circle Media Studies at the University of Amsterdam. He holds a BA and MA in History, as well as a BA in Media and Culture. Active in the film industry since 2011, Maarten has participated in numerous



international film festival juries, panels, workshops, and pitching sessions. Renowned for his expertise in providing guidance and feedback during rough-cut screenings, he is also a skilled host and moderator for Q&As and industry events.

Jacob has programmed films by and about legendary artists like Charli XCX, William Basinski, and Kenneth Anger.

The constant hum of dance music powers a spiritual journey through the Moroccan desert in Óliver Laxe's *Sirāt*. A father's (Sergi López, *Pan's Labyrinth*) search for his missing daughter brings him and his son to a rave in the Sahara Desert, amidst a period of civil unrest. Latching onto the roving convoy of ravers, the travellers slowly find themselves embedded in a new community where music remains a constant release from the world around them.

Sirāt deftly moves between metaphysical drama and white-knuckle thriller in a film that evokes Henri-Georges Clouzot's *The Wages of Fear* with shades of Gaspar Noé's *Climax*. A bass-heavy score from French techno musician Kangding Ray reverberates throughout each scene and character of Laxe's film, funneling them through the liminal space between catharsis and conflict.

That Laxe's film feels post-apocalyptic in both its setting and structure complements an otherworldly energy channelled through the film's meditative trek through grief and mourning. Produced by Pedro Almodóvar and winner of the Jury Prize at the 78th Cannes Film Festival, *Sirāt* is a singular and immersive depiction of the end of the world that will leave audiences speechless while its characters desperately seek refuge from the chaos. -CC



The Last Viking, the latest dark comedy by Anders Thomas Jensen (e.g. *Adam's Apples*, *Riders of Justice*), centres on two estranged brothers whose uneasy yet heartfelt reunion sets off a chain of increasingly absurd and unsettling events.

When Anker (Nikolaj Lie Kaas) emerges from prison after a fifteen-year sentence for bank robbery, his goal is simple: retrieve the loot his brother buried before he was caught. But Manfred (Mads Mikkelsen), the only person who knows the hiding place, has a dissociative disorder and now goes through life as John. Not just any John, but John Lennon of The Beatles. And John Lennon has no idea where the money is.

What follows is a bizarre, darkly humorous road trip in which the brothers chase not only the hidden loot but also their own fractured bond. Along the way, the film explores love, identity, brotherhood, loyalty, and the fragile line between sense and delusion, all delivered with Jensen's unmistakable mix of absurdity and heart. And who knows: perhaps The Beatles will be reunited after all. - MS



The Love That Remains is Iceland's official submission for the 2026 Academy Awards in the International Feature Film category. At its heart are Magnús, a fisherman, and Anna, an artist—two souls from vastly different worlds bound together by a profound love. The film traces their separation and the evolving lives of their three children over the course of a single year.

Told through a series of vignettes, the narrative delicately portrays how a family navigates change with tenderness and resilience, capturing the bittersweet rhythms of shifting domestic life. Time itself emerges as a central motif: Anna's artwork rusts, while a mannequin repeatedly pierced by the children's arrows becomes a haunting time-lapse of transformation.

Unafraid of the unexpected, the film ventures into surreal territory—a dream sequence where Magnus is pursued by a giant rooster, or a montage of mushrooms torn apart in close detail. 

In this dream-soaked universe, Mia - a fierce rebel-rouser with more attitude than direction - confronts surreal demons, fractured memories, and the long-buried traumas she's spent years running from. The farther she runs, the deeper she falls into a chaotic subconscious labyrinth where monsters wear familiar faces and creativity demands a sacrifice she never expected.

Shot on lush 35mm and gritty Super 8, *Lucid* pulses with a visually salient, handcrafted aesthetic - equal parts punk, poetry, and nightmare. As Mia battles through dreams and delusions, she slowly discovers that becoming an artist isn't about escaping the hole she's fallen into, but understanding how it has shaped her. - DR

Mildlife is a raw, heart-thumping coming-of-age story about music, family, and finding your voice—literally. Lawrence just wants to drum his depression away in his hardcore band with his best friend. But he’s introverted, they haven’t booked a single show, and his girlfriend wants them to leave the only town he’s ever known. Meanwhile, he navigates a complicated, co-dependent relationship with his parents, both living with cerebral palsy.

Written and directed by Cory Thibert, who grew up exactly like Lawrence, *Mildlife* offers a story rarely seen on screen: a realistic, unflinching look at a family living with disability. The film rejects tired clichés of over-inspirational or sympathetic portrayals, instead showing Lawrence’s parents as fully realized, flawed human beings. In a deliberate act of authenticity, the roles are played by actors who also live with cerebral palsy, bringing lived experience to every scene.

Hilarious, chaotic, and deeply heartfelt, *Mildlife* celebrates resilience, love, and the messy, imperfect ways families survive. It’s a loud, honest, and unforgettable story that will resonate with anyone who’s ever struggled to find their place in the world—or their band.

Mildlife is a coming-of-age film that follows Lawrence, as he navigates every (not so) simple decision... one scream at a time. -MH

Tree-planters Darcy and Alex share a hard-won sense of freedom, and on the heels of a season in the bush, an unexpected romantic connection begins to form. What starts as an easy camaraderie deepens into something more as the two set off on a summer road trip through the sweeping landscapes of British Columbia. United by their love of van life and the outdoors, they traverse 1,600 kilometres in a vintage 70s Volkswagen camper, discovering each other through unguarded conversations, quiet moments, and the wild beauty that surrounds them.

Vermilion is a queer, character-driven mumblecore gem, blending an improvised script with naturalistic, intimate performances. Shot over eight days with a tiny crew and filmed in real time from Prince George to Vancouver, the film captures the raw spontaneity of a journey where the road shapes the story. Both tender and adventurous, *Vermilion* invites audiences into a romance born not of grand gestures, but of shared space, open skies, and honesty only found through conversation. -KM



Victoria-born photo-journalist director, Jessica Earnshaw, earned rave reviews and a Tribeca Festival award for her 2021 documentary, *Jacinta*, an empathetic portrait of intergenerational mother-daughter prisoners against a background of addiction and trauma.

Her latest, *Baby Doe*, which premiered at the South by Southwest Film Festival, again proves Earnshaw's talent for achieving deep access with her subjects in this exploration of a harrowing true crime story, set against the background of the psychological phenomenon of pregnancy denial.

Gail Ritchey, a devout middle-aged Christian woman living with her family in suburban Ohio, had a baby when she was 22 years old in 1993. In 2019, Ritchey, now a grandmother, was arrested for murder when DNA evidence tied her to an infant's corpse found in the woods. When confronted with the evidence by the police, Ritchey said she was unaware that she was pregnant until she gave birth, and had no memory of how she disposed of the baby after it was born, though she asserts it was stillborn.

Earnshaw developed a close trust with Gayle, her husband Mark, and three grown children, before the trial took place, and this close rapport helped give Earnshaw access to police interrogations, consultations with lawyers and family reactions in a story that proceeds with a series of jaw-dropping twists. Unlike too many non-fiction films that exploit crime stories for vicarious thrills, Earnshaw is open to compassion and questioning the usefulness of punitive justice. - LL





By 2030, Switzerland is expected to face a shortage of 30,000 nurses, as more than a third of newly trained nurses leave the profession within four years. Globally, the deficit may reach 13 million. With *Late Shift*, writer-director Petra Volpe sounds the alarm, portraying a healthcare system stretched to its limits by following one nurse through one night in a single Swiss hospital.

Floria is working the late shift — and she knows the drill. Experienced, steady and resourceful, she navigates constant understaffing with a level of multitasking that borders on superhuman. Between administering treatments, coordinating emergencies and keeping the ward moving, she somehow still manages to offer comfort, presence, and emotional support. Because a nurse, the film reminds us, is never “just” a medical professional.

As the night unfolds, the pressure mounts, tasks multiply, tempers rise, and the emotional weight of the job intensifies. The smallest complaints and sharpest remarks from patients land heavily. What begins as a routine shift gradually becomes a portrait of a profession pushed far beyond what any one person can reasonably endure.

Late Shift offers an urgent, deeply human look at the realities of modern nursing. It’s a film that may just change the way you see the next nurse you meet. - MS

Mr. Nobody Against Putin is a revealing feature-length documentary by David Borenstein and Pasha Talankin, following Pasha, a primary-school teacher in a small Russian town who becomes an unexpected chronicler of his country's expanding state control over education. In today's Russian schools, political expectations are woven into everyday routines through history lessons mandated from Moscow, patriotic assemblies and activities meant to shape a sense of national duty in even the youngest pupils, steering them toward a worldview aligned with the ongoing war.

As the school's designated videographer, Pasha is tasked with filming these activities as proof that the mandated curriculum is being carried out. Through his camera, he witnesses how pressure filters down from administrators to teachers and, ultimately, to the children themselves, who are increasingly pressured to accept military involvement as an expected part of their lives. Troubled by what he sees, Pasha continues filming as an act of rebellion.

When the consequences of disobedience grow sharper, he makes the dangerous decision to smuggle his recordings to Europe. The film that follows is a rare, unvarnished look at everyday life inside a system tightening its grip. It is told through the eyes of a man who risks everything to make that reality visible. - MS



Annemarie Jacir, the acclaimed Palestinian director known for intimate dramas like *When I Saw You* (2012) and *Wajib* (2017), delivers her most ambitious feature yet with *Palestine 36*. This epic historical work broadens her scope to rigorously explore the legacy of British colonial activity and the events leading up to the Arab Revolt of 1936.

The film incorporates a large and impressive cast, including renowned Palestinian actors Hiam Abbass and Saleh Bakri as passionate rebels, and Jeremy Irons as the high commissioner Sir Arthur Wauchope. The narrative follows various characters as villages across Mandatory Palestine rise against British rule. Central to this is Yusuf, who drifts between his rural home and the restless energy of Jerusalem, longing for a future beyond the growing unrest. As Jewish immigrants arrive seeking refuge from antisemitism in Europe, the Palestinian population unites in the largest and longest uprising against Britain's 30-year dominion. All sides spiral towards an inevitable collision—a decisive moment for the British Empire and the future of the entire region.

Ambitious in both scale and scope, *Palestine 36* offers context, humanity, and complexity to the history that continues to unfold today. The film serves as a powerful warning of how the events of 1936, and the preceding decades of British colonial rule, would permanently mark the region's future. As Jacir stated in an interview with the Financial Times, this history is at "the origin of where we are today." - JD



In her solo directorial debut, Eva Thomas (*Aberdeen*), brilliantly weaves the intertwined stories of title characters Nika and Madison, played by Ellyn Jade and Star Slade. Nika comes back to the Rez from Toronto to see if she can mend her friendship with Madison, who prefers life in the community and in the bush. There is visible tension when they see each other again, and it is not going to be healed quickly because Nika rebuked Madison's offer to go to the local pub.

After being assaulted by an officer, Madison is saved by Nika who, despite her misgivings, still keeps a protective eye out for their best friend and relative. Feeling the panic of the moment and a healthy distrust of the system, Nika and Madison go on the run, from the Rez, then to the bush, and finally to the big city with the police on their trail. They work through the hard parts of their relationship and find moments of levity and a powerful resolve to stay free.

This film emerges from the director's previous short *Redlights*, where she exposes the euphemistic practice of "Starlight Tours," where Indigenous people are left outside to freeze after being picked up by the police. This film fearlessly aims the lens back at the system that Indigenous people are forced to encounter, while focusing on the resilience and integrity needed to fight back. - *BC*

Unfolding under the passage of daylight to night, *Powwow People*, is a striking documentary from director Sky Hopinka of the Ho-Chunk Nation. We are invited in to witness a Powwow that was organized by the filmmaking team. This community collaboration enables us to see intimate moments between generations of dancers, singers, and audience members, without the burden of an outsider's lens. Shot on the grounds of the Daybreak Star Indian Cultural Center in Seattle, Washington, Hopinka creates the film in a cinéma vérité style that remains true to the essence of the culture and the protocols of the Powwow, while also offering a look into its future.

The film opens with the familiar sound of a Powwow MC, Ruben Little Head, who keeps the ceremony moving with humour and guidance for the participants. He operates outside of the conventions of a typical documentary narrator. We also hear from Gina Bluebird, one of the organizers who sets the foundation of the Powwow; Jamie John, a non-binary jingle dress dancer who offers wise thoughts on the present and potential future of the Powwow; and singer/elder Freddie Cozad, who connects us to the past and traditions rooted in the ceremony.

The film culminates in a stunning continuous shot of a Northern Traditional dance special, which captures all of the vivid joy and spirit of the dance as well as the quiet moments in between. As the night wraps up, handshakes, hugs, laughter and the comforting voice of the MC welcome the next day. - *BC*



Internationally renowned Inuk director, Zacharias Kunuk (*Angakusajaujuq: The Shaman's Apprentice*), offers his latest award-winning feature, *Uiksaringitara (Wrong Husband)*, which retells an oral story about two lovers who were promised to each other since birth. The boy, Sapa (Haiden Angutimarik), and a girl, Kaujak (Theresia Kappianaq) grow up around each other in camp and eventually they fall in love and begin building a future together. Shot in a direct style, we see tender family moments in camp as they harvest food and visit with each other on the melting shoreline.

All is not a peaceful as it seems. A Monster trolls the water's edge looking to pull in its next victim. There is a thick spiritual energy around the camp after the sudden death of Kaujak's father, which forces her and her mother to leave to become part of a neighbouring camp. Her "future husband" Sapa is out on a hunt while this all happens and he comes back to camp distraught that she has left. Over in their new camp, Kaujak struggles to fend off suitors and take care of her sick mother. Sapa hatches a plan to get her back, and spirits emerge to help and hinder this mission.

The film takes place thousands of years ago and is shot on the immense landscapes of Igloolik, Nunavut in the summer and fall seasons. The score is provided by a talented team of Inuk composers and musicians, matching perfectly with the film's otherworldly visuals and landscape. -BC

When they arrive for a long-overdue visit, Frances unexpectedly announces they want to stay for a year, eager to build a relationship with the grandfather they've barely known. Hannah, however, remembers Jimpa all too well: brilliant, charismatic, unreliable, and often painfully self-involved.

As the visit unfolds, old wounds begin to surface. Hannah must navigate her own resentments while giving Frances the freedom to form their own impressions of Jimpa. Meanwhile, Jimpa—now aging and feeling increasingly sidelined in his work—grapples with what it truly means to show up for family after years of distance.

Tender, funny, and beautifully observed, *Jimpa* explores the messy imperfections of family and the complexities of parenting at every age. Radu Jude, a Romanian moralist with an anarchic black comic streak, broke through the international film world with his Berlin Golden Bear winning 2021 drama, *Bad Luck Banging or Loony Porn*, about a school teacher's home sex tape gone viral during COVID, followed by the 2023's film about the gig economy, *Do Not Expect Too Much From The End of the World*. His latest film, which riffs on the title and themes of Roberto Rossellini's *Europe '51*, is set in Transylvanian capital of Cluj-Napoca, where dilapidated Communist era buildings and burnt-out cars sit next to cookie-cutter new office buildings and housing developments constructed by multi-national companies. When a once famous athlete, now homeless, is evicted from his temporary basement shelter, the man takes his life. The bailiff who ordered his eviction, Orsolya (Eszter Tompa), is traumatized with guilt, telling everyone she meets about the gruesome details of the man's death.

Everyone from her husband, a priest, and a bicycle courier, assure her it was not her fault — and that life must go on. A broad but incisive exploration of the way we live, *Kontinental '25* brings both empathy and a wry perspective to the way we live now, from housing shortages, the rise of right-wing politics and the limits of performative charity, while suggesting there are no innocents in a system that is predatory by design. -LL

Levers, the sophomore feature by award-winning Manitoban filmmaker Rhayne Vermette (*Ste. Anne*), is an astonishing experience that contemplates the reactions of a small-town community when darkness comes calling.

A cannon blast signals the unveiling of a new statue in a Manitoban town. As the crowds gather for the ceremonious occasion, they are unaware of the looming danger that approaches. After the sun disappears for an entire day, residents of the Red River Valley are left shaken by the cataclysmic event. The lives of a sculptor, a security guard, and a civil servant weave together in a surreal series of fractured chapters, each more mysterious than the last. A dreamlike trance shrouds everything as people huddle around the warm glow of the television screen, becoming hazy silhouettes against the unnatural landscape. *Levers* offers an elegiac reverie on the fragility of life and the slippery relationship humans have with the natural world. Shot in saturated 16mm film on broken Bolex cameras, *Levers* is also a technical marvel that delicately portrays a beautiful concoction of fantasy and familiarity. -JC

Christian Petzold's hauntingly beautiful *Miroirs No. 3* begins with Laura (Paula Beer), a pianist from Berlin, miraculously surviving a violent car crash during a weekend in the countryside. Though physically unharmed, she is shaken by the ordeal. A mysterious local woman, Betty (Barbara Auer), witnesses the accident and takes Laura in, caring for her in a motherly manner. It's a setup that seems like the start of a horror film, but in Petzold's hands it unfolds into something far more delicate and achingly human.

An air of mystery permeates the film, and a subtle tension gradually builds; yet Petzold is far more interested in the quiet, fragile moments that develop between two strangers brought together by unusual circumstances. The women eventually form a family-like routine, which is disrupted when Betty's estranged husband and son reappear. As traumas resurface and the past and present converge, the household dynamic shifts, adding layers of complexity to Laura's temporary refuge.

Petzold's masterfully minimalist and meditative style is on full display in *Miroirs No. 3* as he guides the story with restrained emotional precision. *Miroirs No. 3* is a beguiling film about survival, grief, and connection that gently washes over you.

When job prospects disappear, he receives an offer from Jana (Iranian-born UK-based pop singer Gola), an exiled singer who requests his services as she intends to end her life in protest, once she's finished recording social media videos for her followers. Motjaba takes the unusual job, as macabre as it might be, since he's still trying to send money home to relatives. As the unlikely circumstances that brought them together due to an oppressive regime unfold, Motjaba and Jana form a unique relationship in this quietly satirical look at the politics of censorship.

Director Abdolreza Kahani, himself a filmmaker in exile, impressively balances multiple roles as producer, writer, director, cinematographer and editor retaining total artistic control that draws standout performances from his leads, who highlight the human need for connection in the midst of their mutual displacement. -AR

After a death in the family and the loss of their house, a father loads up his car with his two kids, Ella and Charlie, and embarks on a road trip across the country. Told primarily from the point of view of Ella, with her father’s motivations and destination unclear, she packs her belongings and sets off on the adventure. Set amidst the 2008 housing crisis, a layer of dread permeates beneath the surface as “Dad” — John Magaro (*Past Lives, First Cow*) gives an utterly heartbreaking performance — endures a seemingly endless series of woes that lead him to make a truly unimaginable decision out of desperation.

In director Cole Webley’s debut feature film *Omaha*, which debuted at the Sundance Film Festival 2025, he deftly crafts an understated drama that sits with you long after the credits roll. Striking landscape cinematography from Paul Meyers captures the ineffable beauty of the land between motel rooms on the drive from Nevada to Nebraska. In stark contrast to the heroes’ circumstances, the picturesque setting serves as a powerful reminder of a once-beautiful country that has since lost sight of its values and abandoned its people. - *ML*

Mark Jenkin, the visionary Cornish filmmaker who mesmerized audiences in Victoria with his abrasive folk horror *Bait* and the enigmatic, time-lapsed dread of *Enys Men*, returns with *Rose of Nevada* - a profound exploration of lost souls, forgotten communities, and the ghosts that linger where the land meets the sea.

The film opens with the inexplicable reappearance of a fishing vessel, *Rose of Nevada*, presumed lost to a savage storm thirty years ago. The local community is stunned. Two disparate men—Nick (a quietly intense George MacKay, star of *1917*) and Liam (Callum Turner of *Masters of the Air*)—sign on to crew the resurrected boat, lured by an unspoken promise of the past. The moment their boots hit the deck, a strange, hallucinatory reality begins to unravel. The spectral ship becomes a conduit, opening a portal into an alternative existence — perhaps the past dragging the present backwards, or a reimagined reality.

Jenkin remains true to his distinctive cinematic language, capturing this eerie, time-slipping journey entirely on grainy 16mm film. The result is not merely aesthetic; it is a raw, tactile, and uncanny visual texture that feels strangely reminiscent of the rocks and sea foam of the Cornish coastline. His meticulous, artisanal approach extends into every corner of his craft: the film is developed entirely by hand, with all ambient sound added later as a dubbed mix. These techniques coalesce to create a deeply textured, almost dreamlike atmosphere that heightens the sinister and sombre mood of the work, inviting the audience into a truly immersive and haunting cinematic world. - *JD*

If you have ever had a desire to stare at, touch or tell your secret thoughts to... a tree, *Silent Friend* is the film for you. Hungarian director, Ildikó Enyedi (*On Body and Soul*), brings us a film which stars a majestic ginkgo biloba in a German university's botanical garden. Over a century, in three different eras, the tree observes humans investigating the communicative powers of plants.

Each section of this triptych is rendered with a different technique: In 1908, shot in black and white on 35mm, student Grete (Luna Wedler), finds a reprieve from the school's pervasive misogyny by photographing plants. In 1972, in grainy 16mm colour, a socially awkward farm boy, Hannes (Enzo Brumm), finds a connection with a geranium that belongs to a hippie romantic interest. In 2020, shot in crisp digital, the great Tony Leung (*In The Mood for Love*) in his first European film as Tony, a visiting Hong Kong neuroscientist, who, locked down in COVID, extends his research on infant neurology to the electro-chemical activity in plants, via Zoom talks with a French researcher, Alice (Lea Seydoux). As Tony develops a bond with Alice, he also finds himself drawn to the imposing ginkgo tree, adding digital sensors to its trunk and providing it with "tree sperm" from a sample Alice mails to him; if the tree doesn't actually smile, it definitely lights up in this sexy and enchanting film. -LL

These questions of identity and discovery are at the centre of Kunsang Kyirong's *100 Sunset*. A confident and deeply personal directorial debut about contemporary immigrant life in Canada. Shot with non-professional actors and working in collaboration with Toronto's vibrant Tibetan-Canadian community, the film has an incredible sense of authenticity that enriches every frame. It is also aided by sharp editing and subtle cinematography that helps to build the film's mystery throughout the story.

Overwhelmed by the constant clamor, she finds brief moments of solace by removing her hearing aids to escape the relentless bustle.

Her outlook begins to shift when she meets Elijah (Alex Lawther), a free-spirited Californian drifting through Paris with no real plan. 

When his teacher suspects the brash teenager may be a generational talent, they invite the Cuban dance master Dino Carella to evaluate him. The openly gay, imperious teacher, and the rebellious, macho teenager clash, but they eventually form a deep bond over the joy of dance. The film concludes with a solo performance by Soares himself, in a dazzling demonstration of the fusion of strength and grace. -LL



The film follows the plight of Molly, a young single mother brilliantly portrayed by Posy Sterling. Recently released from prison, Molly battles desperately to find secure housing for herself and her children. To her growing horror, her domestic precarity creates a systematic barrier to accessing her kids, who are subsequently placed into the care system against her will. This decision creates a nightmarish paradox: without her children, Molly is pushed down the housing priority list, trapped in a relentless loop of "sorry but No" responses from a system that cannot account for real-world lived realities.


While the subject matter is heavy and often deeply infuriating, Hudson skillfully avoids mere misery porn, always leaving space for joy, friendship, and solidarity. A beacon of light and positivity is provided by Molly's best friend from school, who is navigating a similar housing dilemma. Their bond reminds us that even in moments of darkest despair, community support can help forge new paths when the established systems show only blocked roads. -JD

As their connection deepens, Feng Xia experiences a profound late-in-life awakening—one that challenges everything she thought she knew about herself, her marriage, and the obligations she carries as a mother and wife.

Caught between family expectations and the pull of her own truth, Feng Xia steps cautiously toward a new kind of freedom, creating space for a love that feels both terrifying and exhilarating. This intimate, character-driven drama explores desire, identity, and the possibility of reinventing one’s life at any age. -KM

Los Domingos marks a compelling new chapter from Spain's rising auteur Alauda Ruiz de Azúa, whose films *Lullaby* and *Querer* have earned her acclaim for their tender, character-driven storytelling. Set in her native Bilbao, the film follows 17-year-old Ainara (Blanca Soroa, in a stunning debut performance), a bright and thoughtful teenager on the cusp of deciding her university future. But Ainara's life takes an unexpected turn when she begins to feel a divine calling and chooses to enter a cloistered convent, leaving her family grappling with shock, confusion, and a profound sense of loss.

Ruiz de Azúa, who was raised outside the Catholic faith, approaches the story with a unique outsider's perspective, exploring both the intensely personal spiritual journey of Ainara and the ripple effects on her family. The result is a deeply empathetic portrait of faith, choice, and familial bonds, where tension and tenderness coexist in equal measure. Soroa's nuanced performance anchors the film, providing a quiet yet gripping sense of mystery as religion increasingly shapes Ainara's life.



Helmut, an aging man with a stubborn streak and a sweetheart, is there on a highly unusual mission: to unearth the urn of his ex-wife, Helga.

What begins as an unlikely encounter soon becomes an unexpected friendship across generations. United by loss—Helmut, too, once lost a child in circumstances that echo Paula’s—they set off together in Helmut’s camper van. Their comedic and emotional journey will take them across breathtaking landscapes of Northern Italy, from the rugged beauty of South Tyrol, where Helga’s ashes belong at the house they once shared together, to Paula’s destination of Trieste, where she hopes to honor her brother’s birthday.



Accompanied by his filmmaker friend Lee, he journeys to a windswept village where time moves differently, and the rhythms of life are shaped by the sea.

Settling into his aunt's house, Jonah and Lee encounter a cast of locals, including deaf twins Luke and Charlie, whose presence adds unexpected depth to their experience. Yet even here, far from the chaos of the city, shadows linger; the darker currents of human existence are never fully out of reach.

Against this backdrop, the film revels in the rugged beauty of the Scottish seaside. Nature itself becomes a character—an exhilarating, restorative force that frames Jonah's search for renewal. - *RW*

TO THE VICTORY!

VALENTYN VASYANOVYCH

A very meta comedy-drama set in Ukraine in the post-war future, *To the Victory!* is a film about a film director, Roman (played by writer-director, Valentyn Vasyanovych), trying to return to filmmaking, working with his 18-year-old son, while his wife and daughter, who fled to Vienna during the Russian invasion, won't return to the damaged country. Roman's producer, Volodymyr Yatsenko (the film's real producer) and friend Vlad (Vladi Odudenko) persist in making their micro-budget, largely improvised film about men who are pining for their families in exile.

The winner of the juried Platform Prize for distinctive, creative direction at the Toronto International Film Festival, *To the Victory!* was made with a skeleton crew, who both acted in the film and took turns behind the camera. Rather than a conventional narrative, the film unfolds as a series of long-take scenes, some funny, some melancholic, about life in the future of the new abnormal. Several scenes turn out to be part of the movie-within-the-movie, as if concepts such as "reality" and "future" may be ephemeral. ("The only thing foreigners knew about Ukraine before was Chernobyl," laments one character. "And now the whole country is Chernobyl.") Yet, *To the Victory!* is also filled with affection and defiance. The jaunty, ironic title underscores that "victory" in this case, is not about vanquishing the foe, but continuing to persist. -LL

The Finnish farmhouse beer called “sahti” is a sweet, malty, robust ale with a touch of bitterness from juniper berries. Those tasting notes could easily apply to *100 Litres of Gold*, Finland’s nomination for the Oscar’s Best International Film.

This poignant village comedy follows two middle-aged sisters, the irrepressible Pirkko (Elina Knihtilä) and the slightly more sensible, Taina (Pirjo Lonka), who share a house and a gift for making the best sahti in town. Unfortunately, they share a fondness for over-sampling their product and a casual attitude toward collecting payment from their customers. When their other sister, Päivi (Ria Kataja) asks them to make 100 litres of their best sahti for her wedding, they dedicate themselves to making the best brew they can; but they are so impressed by their product that they end up drinking it all. Chagrined and hungover, they strike out on a quest to replenish the supply.

Prolific Finnish director Teemu Nikki has styled the film in the warm colours and the widescreen of a vintage Western, with slapstick confrontations and rough humour tempered by authentic performances from the two stars and a realistic, non-judgmental recognition of the impact of family trauma and alcoholism. - LL

Oscar takes her under his wing, wants her to share her writings, and invites her to participate in a literary contest. During a dinner celebrating the occasion, Yurlady ends up drinking too much... and a comedy of errors ensues.

Both poignant and endearing, director Simón Mesa skillfully pairs lofty aspirations and ridiculous outcomes in a dark comedy that shows that even in the worst of circumstances, there is heart and a ray of hope that may finally shine.

Beautiful and Neat Room is a strikingly original film by Austrian-born, NYC-based filmmaker Maria Petschnig that blends fiction and documentary with exceptional clarity and sensitivity. Following a fiercely artistic woman navigating life in Brooklyn, the story explores her decision to cohabitate with a succession of seemingly harmless—but secretly unhinged—roommates in order to afford a small apartment. Each bizarre, boundary-pushing encounter forces her to confront not only the quirks and extremes of human behavior but also her own norms and limits.

Drawing from Petschnig's own experiences sharing her living space with over 60 roommates across 22 years, the film achieves an autofictional resonance that feels both intimate and universally relatable. Through spatial minimalism, carefully chosen camera angles, and natural light, Petschnig creates an atmosphere that heightens the shared experience of fundamental existential questions while reflecting the precarious, often surreal life of a contemporary visual artist.

A real-life Avatar that is gripping for both science and cinema nerds, *A Life Illuminated* is the type of film experience that has to be seen on the big screen.

“You can have a life with joy and hope and love, but it’s not always easy.” This is one of many nuggets of wisdom 90-year-old Agatha Bock offers from her solitary slice of paradise in southern Manitoba. Her aging ailments are reflected in the sprawling maples and rustic buildings on her 54-acre family farm, which requires constant maintenance. Meanwhile, abundant crops, pickles, and jellies signal optimistic preparations for the future. Efficiently cultivating a garden with heirloom seeds, methodical processes of sowing, harvesting, and preserving by hand easily fill her days. In 16mm detail, delicious pops of red and green showcase seasons of simple living sprinkled with tips on planting potatoes and picking watermelons. With a handcrafted aesthetic perfectly matching its subject, Amalie Atkins’s marvellous debut documentary honours her aunt with a guide to living in harmony with nature through honest work, where nothing’s wasted and self-sufficiency is a necessity. -AR

BUDDHA JUMPS OVER THE WALL

PEDRO PEIRA

The title of *Buddha Jumps Over the Wall* refers to a Chinese traditional story according to which the emperor's cook made a dish so deliciously fragrant that a nearby monk leapt over a wall to try to taste it. In Pedro Peira's documentary, it refers to jumping over culinary walls, particularly between the Basque country cuisine of chef David Yárnoz of the Michelin-ranked restaurant, El Molino de Urdániz, in Navarre, Spain, and the cuisine of Taipei, where Yárnoz opened a second restaurant in 2019.

The documentary begins with Yárnoz's return to Taipei for the first time in three years following the COVID pandemic. After ensuring the Taipei restaurant is maintaining its quality standards, Yárnoz goes on a tour of the local culinary scene, meeting local masters including French-trained Yu-chung Li, who became Taiwan's first woman chef to achieve a prestigious Michelin ranking, and Chef Kai Ho, founder of the country's first three-star Michelin restaurant, Tairoir (a portmanteau of Taiwan and terroir).

An easy-going foodie hangout film, *Buddha Jumps Over the Wall* does a lot of jumping about, visiting restaurants and vineyards, farms and open-air night markets. Buddha brings to mind a favourite Basque culinary tradition: pintxo bar hopping, in which food enthusiasts go from establishment to establishment, sampling a variety of tasty bite-sized mini-snacks called pintxos (literally "spikes") with combinations of food stacked on a piece of bread and held together with a toothpick. When Chef Kai comes to visit Navarre, Chef Ho sits at the bar counter with a glass of beer, demolishes a pintxo in a single bite, smiles and asks his friend, Yárnoz, "How do you say 'yummy?'" -LL

Filipino director, Lav Diaz (*Norte, The End of History*) is known as a key figure in slow cinema, an arthouse genre characterized by minimalism, long takes, and little narrative. Yet his latest film is relatively mainstream, in vibrant colours and far-flung locations, as it explores the history of the famous explorer, Ferdinand Magellan, played by globally recognized star, Gael García Bernal, who plays the role with a distant reserve.

After setting out from Spain in 1519 on a mission to circumnavigate the world, Magellan was killed by natives two years later in the Philippines, a country named after the Spanish king who financed the journey, and the director's homeland. First impressions aside, no one could confuse this haunting, meditative study with a conventional biopic.

Set over 15 years, sweeping in scope but tautly disciplined, *Magellan* unfolds in a series of transfixing painterly wide shots that set the actors against the natural landscape. There is no musical score, and devastating battles are not shown onscreen, instead represented by their aftermath with corpses strewn about the landscape, reminiscent of Francisco Goya's images of the devastation of war.

Like Werner Herzog's *Aguirre, The Wrath of God* (1972) and Lucretia Martel's *Zama* (2017), *Magellan* probes the violent legacy of colonialism, through the biography of a schoolbook hero who embodied the Age of Discovery's lethal blend of religious conviction, avarice, and European supremacy. -LL

Visitors step into a distorted arcade where reality “glitches,” and animatronics awaken in unexpected ways. The space evokes the eerie charm of abandoned game halls, blending vibrant neon aesthetics with unsettling mechanical life. The installation explores themes of nostalgia, decay, and the uncanny—inviting audiences to question the boundaries between play and fear, technology and life from a Gen Alpha perspective. Medium: Refurbished animatronics, retro arcade props, multimedia screens.

Artist Bio

Elias is a young emerging creator whose work focuses on bringing fictional creatures and characters into real, physical motion. Influenced by childhood puppet fascination, the creations of Jim Henson, and classic practical-effects films like *Gremlins* and *Alien*, he builds animatronic figures from found materials such as old toys, thrift-store parts, and cardboard. His pieces are designed to provoke curiosity through unexpected movement and stylized designs that transform familiar objects into something alive. Elias recently showcased his work at the Brackendale Art Gallery Haunted House, where audience reactions fueled his passion for building even more ambitious creations.
